Guidelines for Living in an American Home

O At the front door:

- Leave wet or muddy shoes at the door.
- Lock the door when you leave.
- Don't share your family's house key with anyone else.
- Turn off the lights when you leave a room or the home.



O In the kitchen:

- Put away food after you take it out.
- Put your dirty dishes in the dishwasher.
- Wipe the counter tops after you cook or eat.
- Sweep or wipe up when you spill on the floor.
- Turn off the oven, stove burners and small appliances when you are finished.



O In your bedroom:

- Vacuum or sweep your room once a week
- Empty the garbage can in your room.
- Don't leave old food or unwashed food containers in your bedroom.
- Keep your clothes put away.







O In the bathroom:

- Put toilet paper in the toilet after you use it.
- Flush after each use.
- Put toilet seat cover down after each use.
- If you spill on toilet or floor, clean up right away.
- Clean toothpaste or hair from the sink when you finish.
- Put your personal products away each day.
- Girls do make-up and hair in your bedroom unless you have a bathroom for your use only.
- Hang your wet towel or washcloth after use.
- Put shower curtain "inside" shower during your shower.
- Dry the floor if it gets wet.
- Use the shower for 10 minutes only to conserve hot water for others.

In the family room or living room:

- Turn off TV or computer when you are the last person to use it.
- Take dirty dishes to kitchen.
- Put your shoes, clothes and school books away in your bedroom.

O Inviting friends to your homestay:

- Introduce your friends to your homestay family and give your homestay family their phone numbers.
- Ask your family how late friends may stay on weekdays and weekends.
- Call your homestay if you will be arriving home late or staying the night at friends.
- Ask your homestay family for permission to have friends overnight and follow their guidelines.

The most successful families talk to each other when the problems happen.
