Your course will be available in MyMathLab on **September 18th** if you wish to get an early start.

You will need three items: the course ID, the text, and the Pearson MyMathLab access code.

The course ID is harras51654.

You must purchase both the **TEXTBOOK** and the **MyMathLab ACCESS CODE**.

Please log on to MyMathLab no later than **September 20th**, the first day of the quarter.

For initial logon, be very careful as the information you provide cannot be changed.

- Go to http://www.PearsonMyLabAndMastering.com Go to MyMathLab (MML). Follow directions carefully.
- Please do not reverse the input for your first and last names.
- Be sure to capitalize the first letter of both names. Do not, however, capitalize the whole name. This is important because of the way MML alphabetizes.
- It's best to use the email address you use for your SFCC account. Your email address should identify you by name. I will expect every email to have 107/your name/your topic as the subject line.
- As soon as you successfully logon, please send an email to <u>Barbara.Harras@sfcc.spokane.edu</u> with subject line <u>107/Last name, First name/logged on</u> You will receive five extra credit points if you send this email, with subject line <u>exactly</u> as prescribed, by <u>September 27<sup>th</sup></u>.

You will also earn five extra credit points if you post your bio by **September 27<sup>th</sup>**.

It's best to purchase the textbook through the SFCC bookstore, shrink-wrapped with a Pearson MyMathLab (also called Course Compass) access code. The bookstore will have the text listed by the class item number (3789). You may make the purchase in person or on the SFCC bookstore website (bookstore.ccs.spokane.edu/spokanefalls). Be Careful! If you purchase the wrong text, you'll need to also purchase the required text.

You may purchase the book from another source, but it's risky. If you purchase the wrong text, you will need to <u>also</u> purchase the required one. Be sure it will arrive by the first day of the quarter. Be sure to get the thirteenth edition. If you purchase a book without a MML Access Code, you may purchase the MML Access Code online at the Pearson website, but it is usually less costly to purchase them together. Occasionally students choose to purchase MML online and use only the online version of the text. While this is possible, it makes passing the course much more difficult. I don't recommend it.

If you do not have your text by the first day of class, go to the logon for MML and when asked for your access code, choose "temporary access free for two weeks." MML calls this the Grace Period. I expect everyone to log on the first day. If you have not logged on by noon of the fifth day, you will be WITHDRAWN from the class.

You will be doing homework, quizzes, and tests online. YOU ARE REQUIRED TO POST IN THE DISCUSSION BOARD 2-3 DAYS PER WEEK. BE SURE YOU HAVE REGULAR, UNRESTRICTED ACCESS TO THE INTERNET. You will also send me five worksheets by email. The final exam will be a proctored paper and pencil test. Most of you will take the final in the Testing Center at SFCC (30-103)—<u>you will need to make an appointment</u>. To take at one of the extension centers or at an alternate site, you will need to make arrangements. See **Documents>>Final/Proctor Info**.
