

Program

Spokane Falls Community College offers this variable-credit summer program for the study of Spanish in Salamanca, Spain. Participants spend two, three, or four weeks enhancing their proficiency in the Spanish language while experiencing the Spanish culture first-hand. No previous experience with Spanish is required and up to seven college credits of Spanish may be earned. Program is directed by SFCC Spanish Faculty and classes are taught by the native faculty at Colegio Delibes. Classes are scheduled in the morning, leaving afternoons and weekends free for individual study, field trips and recreation.

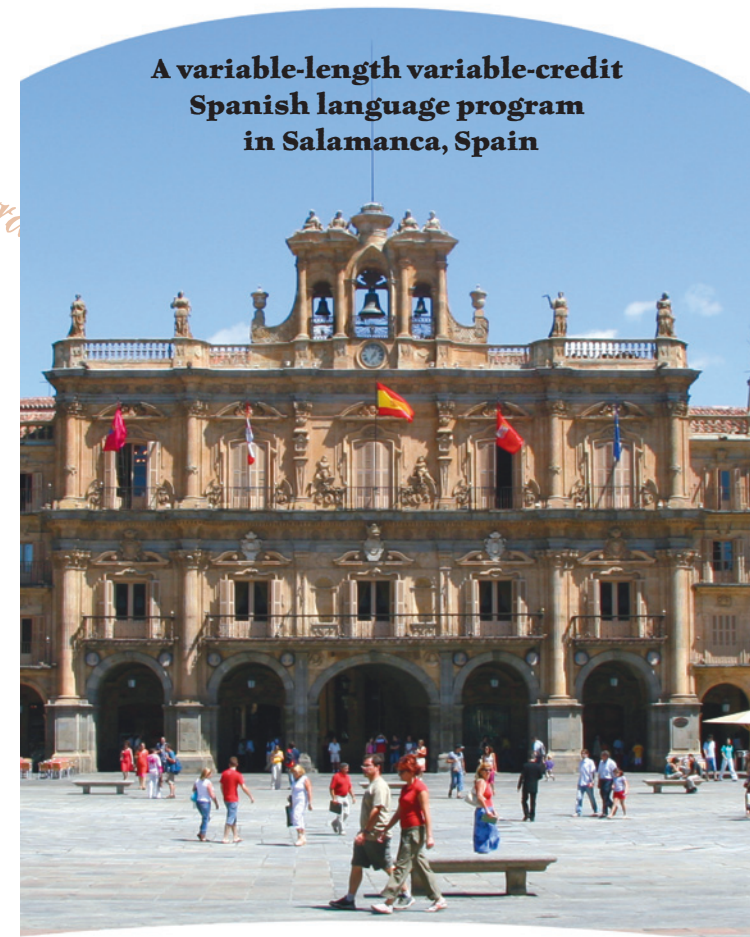

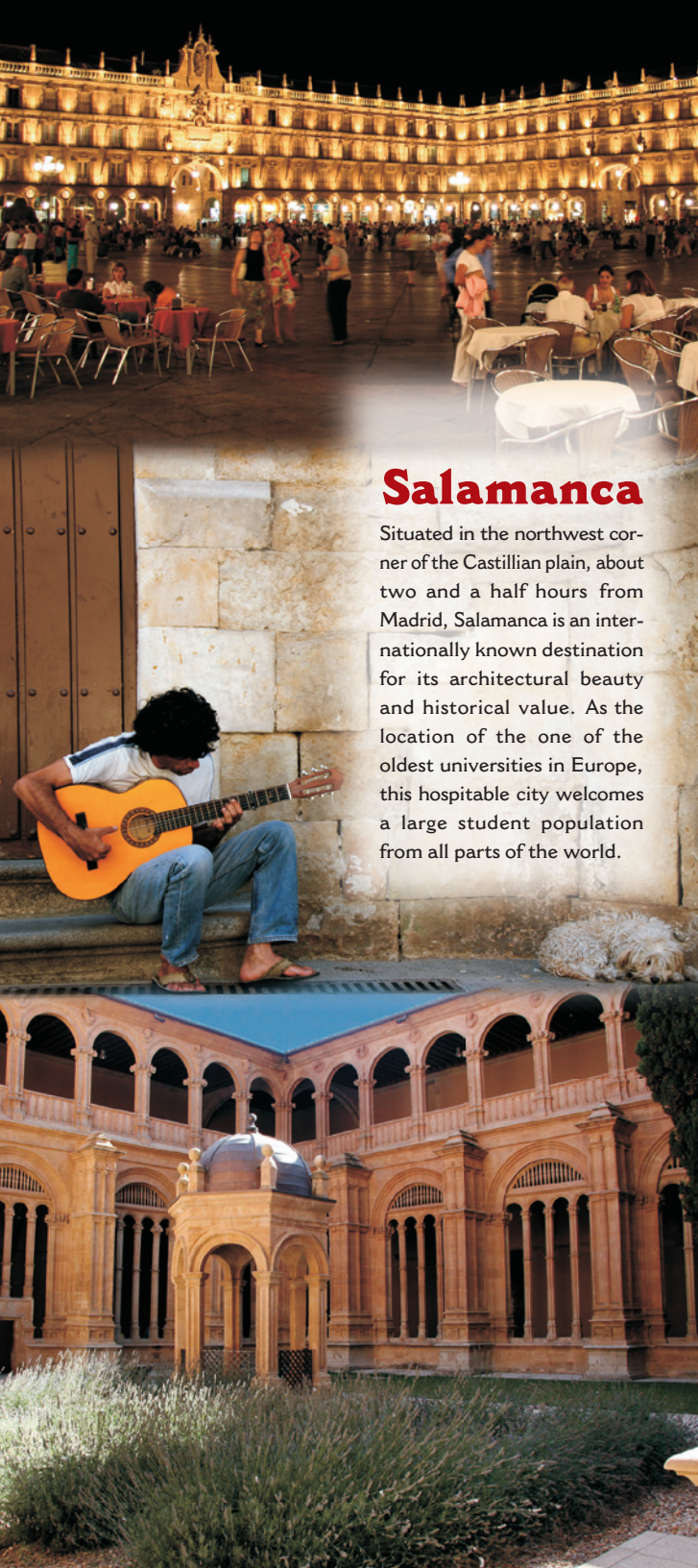

Salamanca

Situated in the northwest corner of the Castilian plain, about two and a half hours from Madrid, Salamanca is an internationally known destination for its architectural beauty and historical value. As the location of the one of the oldest universities in Europe, this hospitable city welcomes a large student population from all parts of the world.

Classes

In consultation with SFCC Spanish Faculty, participants will register for two to seven credits of the classes available:

Elementary Spanish 1, 2, or 3 (121, 122, 123),
Intermediate Spanish 4, 5, or 6 (221, 222, 223), and/or
Spanish Conversation & Culture (241 or 242).

Housing

Participants are placed with carefully selected Spanish host families in a private room, with three meals per day and weekly laundry service provided. Living with a Spanish family gives participants the opportunity to cultivate friendships with native speakers of Spanish and practice Spanish in a very real way.

Dates, Credits and Program Fee

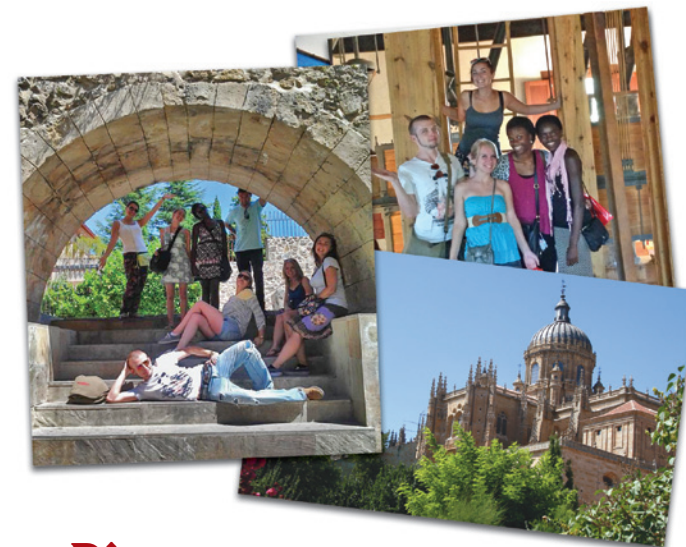
Program fee includes:

- ◆ Classes and textbooks
- ◆ Lodging with a Spanish host family in a private room
- ◆ Three meals per day
- ◆ Laundry service once per week
- ◆ Medical insurance in Spain for the month of August
- ◆ Weekly cultural activities
- ◆ On-site advising services for the duration of the program by SFCC Spanish Instructor
- ◆ Prepaid Spanish cell-phone
- ◆ Bus ticket from Madrid Airport to Salamanca

Not included in program fee:

- ◆ SFCC tuition
- ◆ Airfare & passport fees
- ◆ Bus ticket from Salamanca to Madrid Airport
- ◆ International Student ID Card (*required*)
- ◆ Any other expenses not listed under program fee

Discounts

Participants who are accepted to the program and pay their deposit before spring quarter will receive a discount off the program fee: \$200 if paid by the last Friday of fall quarter, \$100 if paid by the last Friday of winter quarter.

Registration

Fill out application form and submit with essay, unofficial transcripts, and two letters of recommendation by the second Friday in April at the latest. (After that date participants will be admitted on a space-available basis and will be subject to a late fee or \$100). Upon admission to the program, a non-refundable deposit of \$500 toward the program fee is required. The \$500 counts toward the total cost of the program.

Balance due no later than the second Friday in June. (Students qualifying for financial aid need to make arrangements well in advance.) Cancellations after this date will be refunded only on the basis of documented medical or other similar circumstances.
